## The Affidavit

There is an initiative we did called **The Affidavit**, in the spirit of We The People and accountability through public exposure.

Three years ago, we served the prosecution with an affidavit containing eight simple statements they should have been able to affirm, if their conduct was ethical. Not using tampered evidence was among them.

A few advocates, including exonerees Amanda Knox and Valentino Dixon, supported the cause by signing a petition for the prosecution to respond. This was covered in HBO, the <u>NY post</u>, and <u>CBS Morning Show</u>.

They didn't respond directly, but filed our 1-page petition and 1-page affidavit with the court. Please check it out. Attached as **932-2.pdf**.

We served them again before the Rule 33 filing. Of course, no response. Anyways, these things document how long Moira and Tanya have been on notice.

## **Excerpt from CBS Morning Show:**

Knox told CBS News she has no opinion on the guilt or innocence of Raniere and has not followed the case personally enough to make any judgements. She said she was contacted by former members of NXIVM who asked her to sign the petition, which affirmed some principles of prosecutorial conduct that she said "any prosecutor should be able to affirm."

"I signed the petition because violation of these practices would constitute prosecutorial misconduct, regardless of Mr. Raniere's guilt or innocence," Knox said.

Prosecutors declined to comment on the petition and the allegations.
